Your Generosity Breaks Barriers

Far too many children and youth in Ottawa do not benefit from sports and miss out on learning valuable life lessons that sports teach. There are numerous barriers that limit their involvement in sports. These barriers could be financial, health-related, gender or cultural. In 2019, your generosity helped us break through some of these barriers to get children and youth off the sidelines and into the game so they could experience the power of sports and excel to achieve their full potential.







Breaking Barriers for Children and Youth with Disabilities

- **90** children and youth living with autism participated in multisport programming
- 25 blind and partially sighted children and youth participated in a learn to skate and play hockey program

Many barriers stand in the way of children and youth with disabilities participating in sports, including a lack of opportunities available to participate in sports programs. By leveraging our resources and sports teams, we have formed partnerships with Ausome Ottawa and Canadian Blind Hockey to ensure that inclusive and accessible sports programs are available for children and youth with autism and blind or partially sighted kids. Thanks to your generosity, more children and youth with disabilities in our region now have the opportunity to have regular physical activity, learn new skills, develop friendships, be part of a team and boost their self confidence.



Breaking Barriers for Girls

1290 girls served by OSEG Foundation programming

Studies repeatedly show that during adolescence, girls drop out of sports at a significantly higher rate than boys. According to CAAWS (Canadian Association for Advancement for Women and Sport) research, 41% of girls between the ages of 3 and 17 don't participate in sports and as girls enter crucial adolescent years, their overall participation rate drops by 22% and school sports participation drops close to 26%. By 10 years of age, if a girl has yet to participate in sport, there is only a 10% chance that she will be physically active as an adult.

By exiting sports during adolescence, girls miss out on more than just the chance to play - they leave behind intangible lessons that can empower them to grow up to become strong and confident leaders. OSEG Foundation is committed to engaging girls in physical activity, teaching new skills and empowering their potential to develop into the leaders of tomorrow.

On June 14, 2019, OSEG Foundation, in partnership with the City of Ottawa and Fast and Female, hosted the first Sports Day the Girls' Way at TD Place. With a theme of confidence, seven hundred (700) girls in grades 4-8 from across Ottawa came together for a day of inspiration, sports and connection.

In addition to trying new sports and physical activities, the girls were led by strong female role models throughout the day. Because of your support, Sports Day the Girls' Way provided many girls with a powerful and inspirational sport experience that they would not otherwise have had access to.

I would like to express sincere appreciation for the opportunity that you offered to girls at Carleton Heights Public School. We are still floating on a high.

75% of our students come from countries all around the world. Most do not speak English at home. Many come from cultures where women are not regarded as equal and in some cases less than human. Many of these children have seen and experienced things that would be difficult to survive.

Friday lifted our girls up. They saw spaces filled with strong joyful women, inspiring them and showing them, that being a girl is a privilege, not a burden that must be endured.

Creating Opportunities for Volunteer Coaches

140 coaches attended a REDBLACKS Coaching Clinic

Community-based sports programs are dependent on volunteer coaches to run them. These coaches dedicate countless hours of their time as volunteers and play a huge role in influencing thousands of children and youth who participate in these sports programs. Coaches not only teach sport skills and core values, they also have a direct impact on the kids' overall level of enjoyment and engagement in sports. By leveraging our teams, the Ottawa REDBLACKS coaching staff, and your generosity, we continued our investment in coaching clinics for minor football coaches. Building capacity in our local volunteer coaches creates more opportunities for children and youth to stay engaged and experience the power of sports.

Creating Young Champions in Military Families

50 youth from military families became Champions

In collaboration with Support Our Troops, your generosity helped develop and deliver a new multi-sport program for youth of military families. The Be A Champion! program focused on building resiliency for kids experiencing the challenges that come with belonging to a military family. With help from Ottawa REDBLACKS and Ottawa Fury FC players, participants worked on self esteem, communication, teamwork, respect, leadership and determination.



Creating Opportunities for Independence

100 children and youth supported through the Children's Aid Society

In the Spring of 2019, the Children's Aid Society of Ottawa and Children's Aid Foundation of Ottawa piloted a new program designed to support youth transitioning out of care and into independence (GPS Connect, i.e. Guide, Partner, Succeed, Connect). With support from the Bernie Ashe Sports Fund at the OSEG Foundation, 100 children and youth had the opportunity to participate in physical activities or sports. These kids are in the process of learning about financial planning, healthy eating and physical activity, employment and education opportunities, and housing.

Alexander, 9, GPS Connect Participant

Alexander had been acting out at home due to his behavioural outbursts. He has had difficulty making friends at school and he needs to be supervised at all times. Alexander has always showed an interest in basketball. The basketball club he joined coincided with his mother's work schedule, so it was a perfect fit for the family. Alexander has enjoyed every minute of his basketball experience and has started to make some meaningful friendships all while allowing his mother to continue her regular work schedule.

The OSEG Foundation raises funds directly from fans of the Ottawa REDBLACKS and Ottawa 67's through the 50/50 Draw Program. In 2019, OSEG Foundation introduced online 50/50 ticket sales for select games and guaranteed draws to further engage fans directly on giving back to the community. Through the Ottawa 67's playoff run, OSEG Foundation set a new OHL record for the 50/50 draw with a single game jackpot of \$43,000! Additionally, OSEG Foundation dedicated the 50/50 proceeds from one playoff game to the Canadian Red Cross for flood relief efforts in our community along the Ottawa River.


Gourmet on the Gridiron
